PREFACE

The Central Bureau of Statistics presents herewith to the public the second and last volume of the publication concerning the results of the census carried out in East Jerusalem in September 1967.

This volume contains additional data for a number of subjects: marital status, fertility and infant deaths, emigration of sons or daughters, labour force and living conditions. These data are based on the 50% sample enumeration of the population.

The census which was carried out in 1967 in East Jerusalem, supplied comprehensive statistical information on its population; this was of help to the administrative staff of the united city and of the state, to the planners, researchers etc. The census data also made possible the inclusion of the East Jerusalem inhabitants in the regular demographic statistics of Israel.

The Bureau wishes to express its thanks to the Jerusalem Municipality, in particular to Mr. Benbenisti for their assistance in the preparation of the census. Thanks are also due to the numerous staff members who took part in planning and carrying out the census and those who published its results. INTRODUCTION

Data presented in this publication were obtained within the frame of the Population and Housing Census 1967. The boundaries of the census included the area added to the Jerusalem Municipality, excluding the refugee camp in Sha'aft, which numbered 2,732 persons, and Ramat Rachel.

For organization and processes of the census, see the first publication East Jerusalem of the Population and Housing Census 1967 Publications Series.

The questions dealt with in this publication, were included in the sample investigation which comprised about 50% of the households — questionnaire stage "B" for every person aged 15 and above. The demographic data — tables 1-24, are based on these questions. Questions on housing were asked by means of a full enumeration — data on these questions are given in tables 25 and 26 of this publication.

For the sample method, the estimates for the entire population, the sampling errors and the limitations of the data and also for explanation and classifications, see publication <u>East Jerusalem</u>, Part I.

This publication comprises data on various subjects which are mainly a sequel to, and a completion of the information concerning the same subjects appearing in East Jerusalem Part I.
